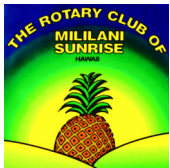

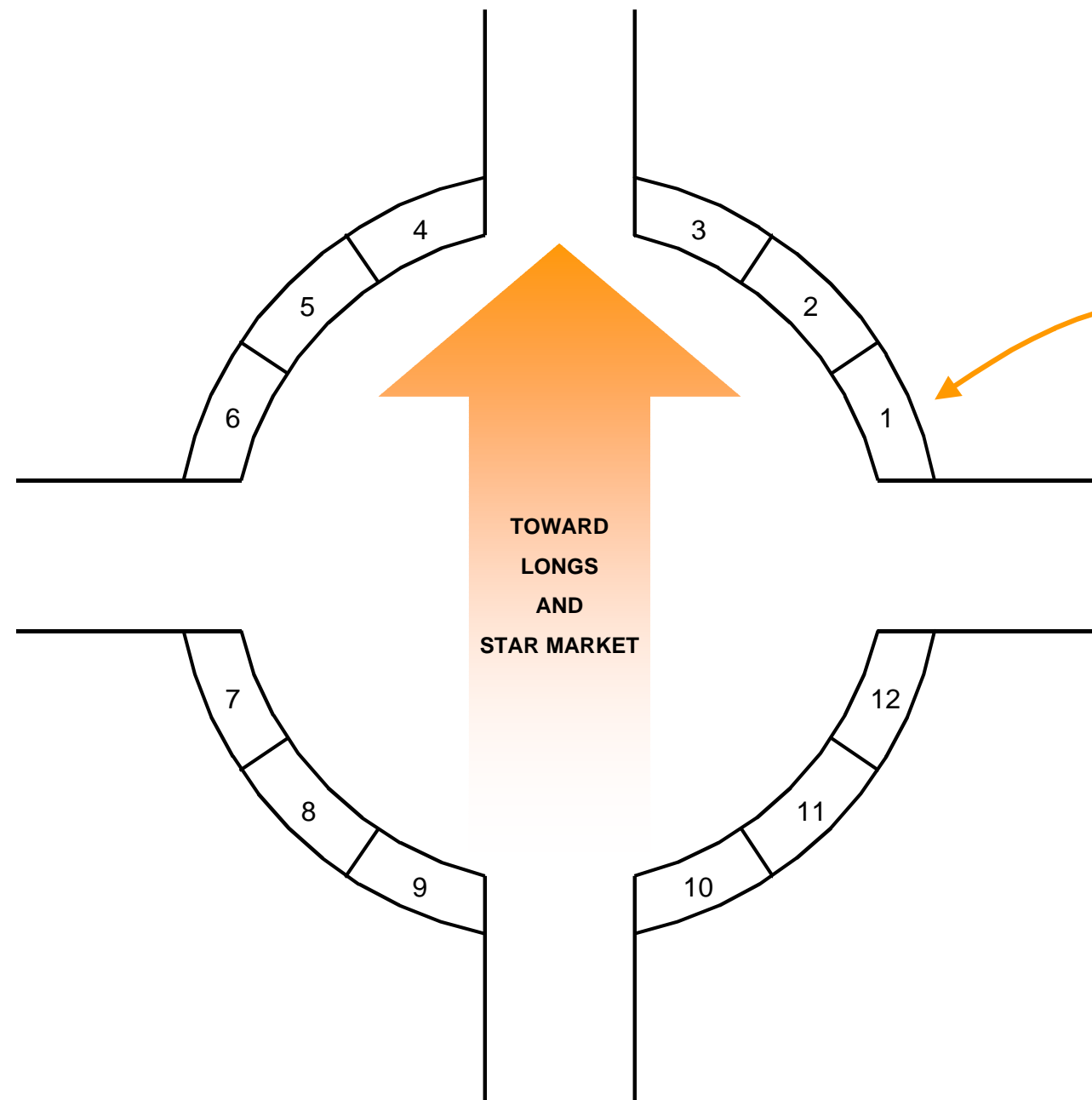

General Arrangement and Assignment of Panels

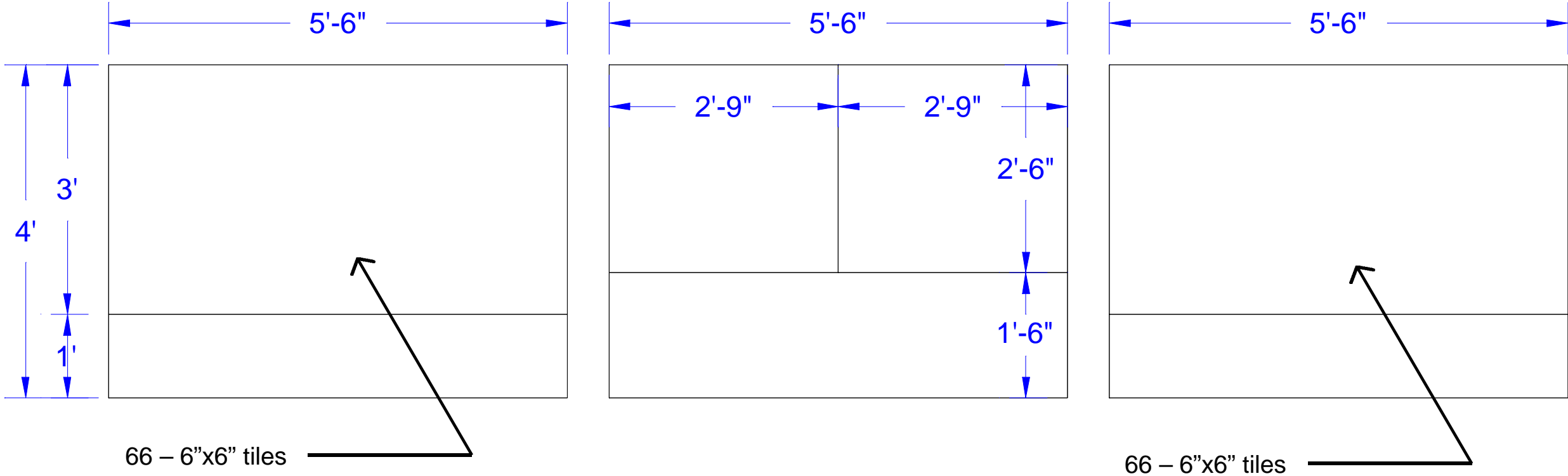

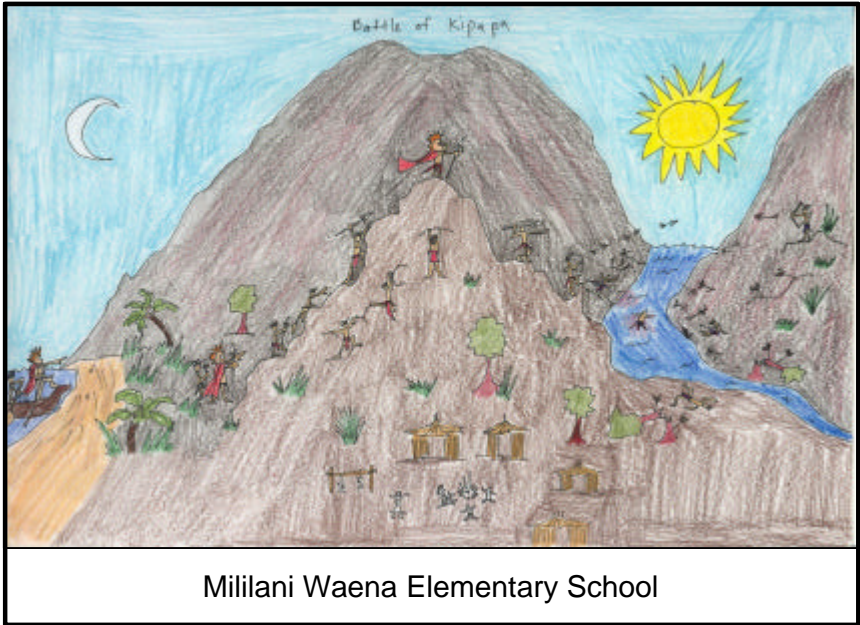

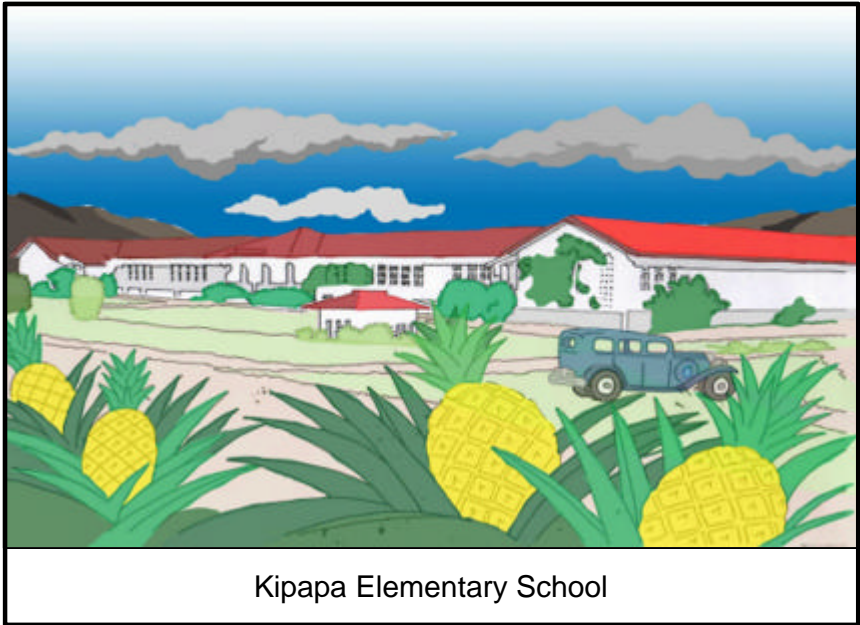

<p>"A Hawaiian legend tells of a war leader, Mr. Kahikulani from Puna, Hawaii who came to battle against Chief Halemano and invaded Oahu and divided the reign of Maikikukahi. Kahikulani first landed in Waikiki and proceeded up the Ewa lagoon and marched inland. At Waikakalaua a battle ensued. Kahikulani stood on the top of the mountain and looked down at the Kipapa stream where his warriors fought against Chief Halemano's warriors. All of Halemano's warriors were destroyed and the land and stream of Kipapa was reddened with blood from this battle. 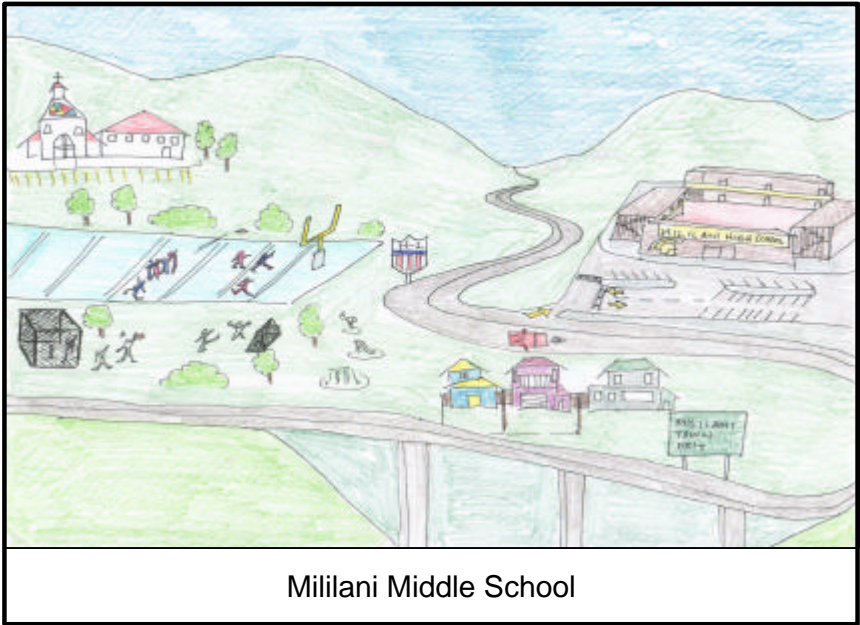
